


UFOs from the files of Project Blue Book

A sketch from Project Blue Book case 2853 shows an unidentified flying object reported at Toms River, N.J., on Nov. 1, 1945. Nearly 130,000 pages of declassified UFO records were put online by UFO enthusiast John Greenewald, who spent nearly two decades filing Freedom of Information Act requests for government UFO files.





A photograph from Project Blue Book case 24-185-19-7X shows an object over Phoenix in June 1947.



At approximately 1320 Sgt Cook from the CO's office notified the observer (T/Sgt Quinton A Blackwell) that according to Ft Knox Military Police & "B" Town State Police, a large circular object about 250 to 300 ft in diameter was over Mansville, Ky. Advised him to check with Army Flight Svc. They advised negative but shortly thereafter reported object over Irvington, Ky, then Owensboro, Ky. Object first sighted by Blackwell about 1345 to 1350 over south Godman Fld.

Verification: lst Lt Crner (Detachment Commander)
Capt Carter (Operations Officer)
Col Hix (CO) sighted it about 1420

At approximately 1430 to 1440, four P-51's approximed Godman f/south enroute f/Marietta, Ga. to Standiford Fld, Ky. Ex Blackwell asked Flight Leader NG 869 to attempt to identify object. Accompanied by two other planes he proceeded south f/Godman. Fourth plane proceeded to Standiford Fld alone.

About 1145, flight leader (NO 869) reported sighting object "ahead and above - still climbing" At 15,000 ft he reported "Object directly ahead and above and moving about half my speed." Again "it appears metallic of tremendous size." Still later "I'm still climbing - object is above and ahead moving about my speed or faster - I'm trying to close in for better look". This was about 1515. Five minutes later the other two ships turned back. NG 800 reported "it appeared like the reflection of sunlight on an airplane canopy" Shortly afterward this same pilot (NG 800) resumed search going to 33,000 ft, 100 miles south but did not sight anything.

The Project Blue Book Incident 33 report from Jan. 7, 1948, details an unidentified object report from Godman Air Force Base in Kansas.

A sketch of an object reported on Aug.31, 1949, over Sacramento, Calif. According to the Project Blue Book report, "Observers sighted an object with short round nose, very short wings rounded at the tips. There was no trail or noise. It appeared as a dark object having a dull gray or silver finish. It was very fast."

A May 1956 report from Boston shows a photograph of dark objects not seen when photos were taken. The report states, "After extensive review and analysis it was found that the objects are the results of development flaws on the film."

A Project Blue Book report dated Feb. 29, 1956, reports a brilliant object in the Buffalo-Hamburg, N.Y., region. "The brilliant object used evasive action against F-86-D fighter. Color red and white. At times very bright then dim, different altitudes, different speeds. Finally faded out. No radar contact only visual sightings."

A report from Davenport, Iowa, in 1969. Investigators concluded the reports of ground visual sighting were unreliable. Observer also has reports from Nov. 4, 1967, March 1968 and January 1968.

An Oct.21, 1969, report from Twin Falls, Idaho. The observer "was driving his tractor when the headlights and radio went out. He noticed a large light rising over the horizon. From within this light a smaller but much brighter light emerged."
